## **Mastermind Discussion:**

- Strategic Discussion (8:30-9:00) Budget training continued
  - Comparing revenues: Grants and fees, unrestricted and restricted. Breakdown by labor in categories for the budget.
  - The Current unrestricted makes up 83% of our personnel budget. The total personnel budget is going to be 7.7 million and that is about 54% of our combined overall budget. This includes the 1.5 million in Plant for cosmetology.
  - Restricted grants: NEH, TRIO, the federal part of the SBDC.
  - Expenses \$14 million for this year, and we have already spent \$8 million. This is normal to be over half at this time.
  - Actual student waivers for last year were just under \$48,000.
  - Jason Grimmis will be visiting at the next Cabinet meeting. Sandy will send out his job description to assist the cabinet in understanding Jason's position.

  - Kelley made a motion to accept the minutes as amended, and Stephanie seconded the motion. All in favor, none opposed, none abstained: motion carried.

- Al Innovation Symposium at UM Jan 16 Report
  - EAB was focused on determining as a whole corporation the focus of high education. Using chat, GPT when asking a question might reveal sensitive information that could be a risk to our institution. The UM professor from Missoula College presented a more engaging conversation on how AI has impacted everything over the last year. Copilot



previously was Bing Chat and Microsoft made a sales pitch during their presentation. Purchasing the Microsoft package would be one hundred and eight grand a year for the very minimum, but it does integrate all into the Optics Office products.

- Take away from the presentation: If we are not teaching our students how to use artificial intelligence, we are doing them a disservice and we will be left behind and will become irrelevant. This is an equity initiative.
- The affiliation level will have different work groups meeting for recommendations.
- Using Professional Development money for the upcoming year with a focus on Al as a recommendation.
- Ideas: Brown bag lunch to begin a series of AI presentations. Mel would do the first one. Integrate the classified staff into the series through Staff Senate.

## • OCHE Policy Revisions:

- Presented at the CAO meeting if you have any feedback or concerns it will be an item on next week's agenda.
  - Course Format might need a slight adjustment
  - Proposed changes in policy 940.3 new line-item language.
  - Cari will research Student Government, Health Service, and Wellness fees.
- Discussion on Director of Community Education Center Position:
  - Programs within this position: CDL, and Motorcycle Business.
  - Writing the job position so it is more specific on the connection with Helena College management. It is a Self-sustaining program, and it's an integral part of the work at Helena College. Specific integration verbiage will be added noting it is a supporting department and an essential position.
- Work Studies: A federal allocation of seven percent must be used for community-based positions or HC could lose all work studies dollars. No work-study person has worked for America Reads in three years; we were given a waiver this year. Financial Aid will offer a waiver to incentivize a work-study for America Reads.
- **NWCCU Standards Review:** Standard 1A has our mission statement, our education purposes, and our commitment to student learning and achievement. Adjustments discussed on adding career wording into the narrative.
