Marika made a motion to accept the minutes as read, Phil seconded the motion. All in favor, none opposed, none abstained: motion carried.

- 2. NWCCU Year 7 Peer Evaluation Visit Data to Understand
  - a. <u>Dashboard of Institutional Data</u> (select Helena College from the dropdown menu at the top of each visualization) Review of Data on the data.nwccu.org site. Graduation data rates were discussed in detail.
  - **b. NWCCU Data Analysis (ppt file in team files)** IPEDS calculations discussed. Graduation rate total cohorts are rising.
  - c. NWCCU Data notes from Jessie:
    - i. Notes from Discussion
      - 1. Pull some gateway course completion data to complement graduation rates
      - 2. Pull degrees awarded data to compare to graduation and transfer rates



- 3. No retention data in these dashboards how does it look compared to other schools?
- 4. Is time to credential only associates or are certificates included?
- 5. College Scorecard data how the earnings information
  - a. Are these earnings just in Montana or anywhere?
  - b. Is this data tied to individual students?
- 6. How do our overall transfer numbers/rates look, regardless of earning a degree or not?
- d. NWCCU Data Updated and Defined
- 3. NWCCU Year 7 Visit Meeting Prep Questions from Evaluation Team Chair
  - a. How comprehensive is program learning outcomes assessment across academic (including transfer) and nonacademic programs?
    - Academic programs have a system in place that was designed to be comprehensive, but in practice participation is varied, a majority are not participating enough for meaningful data.
      - 1. Majority are not meeting expectation set by Executive Committee of the [Faculty] Senate.
      - Had a couple meetings with Chief Academic Officer (Sandy) and all faculty to discuss assessment but fell out of practice. Division Chairs need to be more involved in enforcing/supporting assessment work
      - 3. Can we get data of how much each faculty is doing? Anecdotal evidence is faculty are either meeting 80% or not doing any at all.
      - 4. Would be nice for faculty to generate their own reports to see what has been done/progress, etc.
    - ii. TRIO/MT have external reporting requirements that provide a framework for assessment in those programs, not many other non-academic programs have learning outcomes. Asked in program reviews to identify what data they use or what they measure to determine success/effectiveness, but a lot of need for training/support has been identified in the first three years of new reports.
  - b. How is Helena College using disaggregated data and comparison institutions to determine areas for priority, celebration, or need for improvement?
    - i. We are working on it. We have disaggregated data, we don't have a regular process to evaluate it from this perspective.
    - ii. Strategic plan KPIs disaggregated FT/PT retention rate, FT/PF math/writing gateway course completion
    - iii. Use of disaggregated data and peers for comparison is happening in pockets as needed.
    - iv. State of the College shows disaggregated data
    - v. Have our peers, haven't started identifying what we're going to look at.
