- Marika Adamek motioned to approve the June 24, 2025, minutes. Paige Payne seconded the motion for Abby Rausch. The minutes were approved unanimously.

Annual Plans:

- **IDEA Review of Final AY2425 Plans**
 - The assignments for the AY2425 Annual Work Plan are in the files.
 - IDEA can begin to track deferred or not completed goals and the reason for the changes.
 - Please complete the reviews by July 25.
- **Goal Deletion Process:**
 - How does IDEA manage a goal that is deleted or written over?
 - Year to year, the goals roll over, but a goal can be deleted, which is the problem.

- The data, continuity, and the reason it was deleted are lost.
- **Decision:** Allow the goal to be deleted, but when the author clicks to delete the goal, it shades to gray and stays recorded in the annual plan.
 - Add instructions clarifying when to edit a goal vs. when to delete a goal, and ask the author to include the reason the goal was deleted.
 - Because it stays in the annual plan, the data is available to track trends and other reasons goals are deleted.

Metrics Tree: Enrollment

- **AAFTE, Annual Unduplicated Headcount, and Fall Census:**
 - AAFTE averages the FTE spread to portray an accurate picture of the enrollment. HCs AAFTE target number is 2%. Helena College's AAFTE is around 700-800. Add the summer, fall, and spring FTE and divide by 2.
 - Annual unduplicated headcount is total unique students attending in an academic year (summer, fall, spring)
 - Fall census is the count on the 15th day.
- **Leading indicators**
 - Applications submitted
 - Applications completed
 - Conversion rate
 - Fall-to-fall retention
 - Fall to spring retention
 - Withdrawal within the first fifteen days of the semester
 - Academic standing – alert --> warning --> suspension (e.g., DE vs general enrollment)
- **Real-time metrics**
 - Weekly registration
 - Weekly drop/withdrawal
 - Advising appointments (new/returning) (non-degree registers without meeting with advisor – get PIN from Registrar's Office)
 - Alerts from instructors
- **Disaggregated**
 - Dual enrollment vs. General enrollment
 - Gender
 - Race/ethnicity
 - Veteran benefits
 - Accessibility services
 - TRIO
 - Pell Eligible
 - MT10
 - Program
 - Student type (new first time, transfer in, etc)
 - FT/PT
 - Age (traditional/non, average age)
 - County/city/zip code
