IAP: KPI-2 Degrees & Certificates Awarded

- Dashboard Discussion:
 - Trends:
 - HC Numbers
 - Increase in the number of HC General Education certificates after the certificate was added in 2022-23.
 - Growth in business certificates.
 - Nursing credentials dropped.
 - Two Certificates of Technical Studies in IT&P are in moratorium.
 - Service Now Administration Studies certificates are missing.
 - Peer comparison
 - There is a large gap between what our peers are doing and HC numbers. Why?
 - Other schools are awarding a lot of less-than-one-year certificates.
 - Micro credentials are popular across the nation.
 - Similarities: The number of associate degrees has decreased, and the number of certificates is increasing.
- Takeaways
 - Add micro credential certificates.
 - Hard to add quickly due to the higher educational process. It can take up to 2 years to add a program, and a quicker process is not in place.
 - Encourage HCs Dual Enrollment students to transfer to HC.
 - Exceeding the set target. Is 3% target still appropriate?
 - HC is offering more certificates.
 - Since business went online, there has been an increase in certificates.
 - Added Cosmetology program.
 - OTA will impact the rate in two or three years.
 - Keep 3% target, as growth may be leveling off
 - Difficult to interpret completions by student characteristics.
 - Add comparison to overall student population
 - 150% graduation rates will provide more context
- Questions about data:
 - Online vs in-person completions? It is difficult to determine the completion rate comparison for students who attend in person versus online.
 - What about Dual Enrollment students who transfer to HC?
 - Are the TRIO completing more because of support, or are there more TRIO students?
