BIOH104: Required. Paramedic prerequisite.

M105: Required. Higher level may be substituted. M121 suggested for BS transfer options.

AHMS144: Required. Paramedic prerequisite.

FIRE110: Required. Class is part of Montana IFSAC/Proboard Firefighter 1 Certification along with FIRE 102 and FIRE 110. FIRE131: Required



COMX115: Required. Paramedic prerequisite.

WRIT101: Required. Paramedic prerequisite. Higher level may be substituted.

FIRE298: At least one session of FIRE298 Required. Up to two semesters are optional for credit. Student should have completed Fire Service Organization membership process BEFORE start of FIRE298.
